#### Going Nowhere in a Hurry

One of the minor pleasures I have in life is watching somebody speed by me in their car and maybe even see them weave in and out of traffic ahead, only to catch up to them at the next stoplight. Even when we miss every light and feel that frustration, traffic people tell us the extra time we lost is at most a couple minutes. Sometimes we have planned everything to the minute and feel anxious and upset by any delay or impediment, taking it to be a personal attack by the universe! And how does that make us feel?

"Moving fast is not the same as going somewhere," is a quote I once read. The quote sure applies to more than traffic! How many times have we hurried our way through an event, a life stage, a blessing (simple or profound), and at the end felt cheated or empty or just plain frazzled? Was it because our thinking was dominated by how to get to the next whatever and the one after that?

Getting to *somewhere* is more than passing through life's stages. It is about carrying some higher purpose with us everywhere we go. The police officer in Colorado who was killed had a solid job and career already but felt a higher calling – a calling of service. The teenager who takes time to notice other classmates is going somewhere long before any career or marriage or questions are settled of where to live. The divorced parent(s) who put the needs of their children ahead of their own desire for retribution against the ex-spouse are helping themselves and their children go somewhere. The retiree who looks for ways to add to the lives of others is going somewhere, too.

God blesses us with this sense of calling. We may not be able to figure out the specifics of "What should I do with my life?" at a particular stage of life or at any stage of life, but through it all the gift of God is not "hurry to the next station." The gift of God is that you have a call from God now (and tomorrow) to have the heart of a servant. Jesus made it clear that gift has nothing to do with speeding by others and weaving in and out of what is ahead; such a life will get you nowhere. Instead, in this moment take your time and concentrate on God's *somewhere*!

#### Details for How We Worship

#### **EASTER**

Worship times are 5:00pm on Saturday & 8:30 & <u>9:45am</u> on Sunday

- All services will be outdoors either on the lawn & parking lot facing toward the education wing (long sidewalk) or if the weather doesn't cooperate facing the main entrance canopy.
- Nice enough weather, but you want to stay in your car? Then park on the south portion of the parking lot, facing west.
- All services will also be live-streamed, and via the FM 88.3 channel for those in the parking lot.
- Enter the parking lot via the Schoolhouse Rd. entry – driving around the Atrium Point complex to the south.
- Bring your own bread or cracker for communion.

#### ALL OTHER WEEKS

#### FOR EVERYONE COMING TO PEACE

\* Modified communion: You can take a piece of bread or cracker with you to the service. At the 8:30 worship, a pre-packaged grape juice & wafer will be available.
\* There is a drop box if you wish to bring an offering with you. Otherwise, we will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.

\* Bathrooms will be available, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing and masks are required.

#### DRIVE-IN WORSHIP ON SATURDAYS AT 5:00PM & SUNDAYS AT 9:30AM

## Our worship location is centered under the main canopy.

\* Masks would be required if you get out of your car. (We have spare masks.)

\* We will have sound projection/speakers for all to hear, plus the FM channel (88.3.)

\* Worshiping outdoors allows us to sing!

## ONLINE OPTIONS CONTINUE INCLUDING AN 8:30 VERSION

\* We will continue to live-stream our worship services. We plan each week to record both Saturday and Sunday. Assuming everything works, all will be available through our Facebook site. We also have an only-livestream inside the sanctuary version at 8:30am for those for whom that option is meaningful.

#### INDOOR WORSHIP only at 8:30am Sundays

Here are the notes if you are planning to come (registrations required)

\* Masks will be required from the time you leave your car until you get back in the car. If you forget yours, we will have spares. (Those who are less than 2 years old or those with special health issues are exempt.)

#### \* Enter and exit through the Fellowship Hall door \* Temperatures will be taken and names will be checked off both to match the sign-up list, as well as if we needed to do contact tracing. You may have to wait a little bit, with spacing between households.

\* There will be no congregational singing of a hymn, except by one worship leader who will be shielded from the congregation. You *can* hum along!

\* We will have pews marked off so that socially distanced spaces can be maintained. Of course, household units can stay together in their pew. Ushers will be available to help guide people, filling in pews from the front of the sanctuary to the back, and at the end of service leaving from the back.

\* We won't be having nursery attendants, acolytes, refreshments, lay liturgists, lesson readers, etc.

\* Between services, the sanctuary and all other spaces will be electrostatically sprayed with a disinfectant that will cover all surfaces.

\* Bathrooms will be discouraged from being used but will also receive attention.

\* Communion will have options: continue to be "bring your own bread or cracker," or take one of the wafers (gluten free or regular) or take one of the pre-packaged kind.

\* If you feel sick or have come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and watch via the live-stream.

\* We are going to need volunteer ushers, temperature takers, and after worship sprayers. You can sign up on the website (Sign Up) or contact the office. These volunteers will need to provide a N95/KN95 mask for themselves. There will be no physical contact with anyone, but the temperature takers will be within the sixfoot space for a few seconds.

Please pray for our world's healing, and for our congregation's ongoing attempts to stay faithful to God and God's leading!

#### From Deacon Shari Trotter

Dear Members and friends of Peace,

At confirmation last night we discussed the commandment that says, "You shall not kill". It turned into a very interesting discussion. There are so many ways where this commandment becomes negotiable. What about war? What about self-defense?

The commandment becomes even harder when we understand God's true intent behind it. You can kill someone without taking their life. Pastor Dave talked with the kids about the importance of words. Words mean something. You can kill someone's spirit with the wrong words.

In our culture words are used very liberally and are not weighed with enough care and concern. Think about our country's political life. Nasty and dismantling words are bipartisan. It is easy to let a word slip from your mouth and immediately regret it. Social Media has significantly multiplied the way in which words can affect someone. Words do not only live for the second that they are spoken. Words typed on a computer screen last forever.

Often, we listen to Jesus words and are confused. Jesus uses parables and questions, and they are often hard to decipher. However, Jesus measures his words. He spoke with grace filled language and put care and concern for God's people always first. How can we learn to speak like Jesus? Jesus also spoke with honesty, calling out systems in his culture that were abusive.

We can use words that build up one another. We can show our children what it means to give your words weight and integrity. When you say I love you, let the word love carry with it the weight of the love of God. When you say I hate something may it be towards systems that wound God's people and not towards one of God's creations. Dear God, May the words of our mouths and the meditations of our hearts be pleasing to you. Amen

#### Faith & Life Experience

We are going to feature stories about people from Peace from time to time. Enjoy this one from Jess Lindeman

Growing up, my family went through the motions of religion. We attended mass when it was possible to get four children, under the age of 12, out of the house before 7:30am. I went to Sunday School periodically, completed the sacraments, and I even sang in a church band! One night during CCD I had asked a slew of questions and my last question must have gotten on teacher's last nerve. I asked, "So how do you know all this God stuff is real?" She replied, "You need to put your head down and be quiet now." Giggles from around the room injected a heat into my face, my stomach, and my heart. After that I was very quiet during CCD and God sat quietly in the background waiting patiently, as I tripped and fumbled, for years.

Fast forward, we were introduced to Peace Church about 15 years ago. The first year we sporadically attended service. We would drop our spawn off at Sunday School each week, and head to coffee to catch up with the adults. One week I was asked if I wanted to teach the 4-year old's Sunday School class. Pastor Dave asked me in person; it was before we were tethered to our email. I was cringing inside. I had no idea how to teach a Sunday School! I really didn't know much about the bible. I was reassured that it was easy, and that I would have anything I could need to teach for the year. I said, "Yes." It helped having my husband, as a co teacher, too.

My first class; I fell in love listening to these little humans tell me about what happened during their week. Weaving Jesus into their lives became something that I looked forward to every week. And that is how I became Miss Jess. I taught P4 for 12 years after that and the last two years I have had the honor of being the superintendent.

So, when one of our youth asks me, "Miss Jess, how do you know this God stuff is real?" I tell them, "It is our belief in God that makes this God stuff real. He is that feeling you have when you get a hug you really need. God is real when someone helps us when we are having trouble. We know that God is real when we have the things we need because, he promised we would. And if we gotta get deeper than that, let's go find Pastor Dave or Deacon Shari." The truth is you don't have to be super Jesus-y to teach. If you have a good heart and the willingness to pass on the Good News to our kids, that is all it takes. The rest you will learn as you go. The kids in our congregation are amazing and it is a privilege to know them thoughout the years. I would love for the adults in our congregation to have the same experience. ## Wish List

From time to time, people want to make "above and beyond" financial gifts to the church. These gifts are not in place of regular, faithful stewardship – giving from the heart, off the top. ## Because of You and Your Gifts

As the largest provider of Foster Care Services in Illinois, Lutheran Social Services of Illinois (LSSI) cares for children who have been removed from their birth families due to abuse and/or neglect and places them with foster families who receive training and support from LSSI. The specialized Therapeutic Foster Care program places children with histories of severe trauma and emotional/behavioral needs into single family homes rather than institutional settings. Since May 2017, the Therapeutic Foster Care program has enrolled 59 children, with 33 successfully completing the program.

## Questions Kids Ask About God

While we wait for more opportunities to share our *Questions Kids Ask About God* book with others, we recognize the questions don't stop. Here are some that were from our Sunday School last year: 1) Was the story of Cain & Abel a real event or was it a lesson to learn from? The story is from a time before there were people writing history, so we don't know if there were two such brothers with those names. But the story is 100% true in how it reflects that siblings are sometimes mean to each other and jealous of each other. God's desire is that we love one another even though we may not always get along.

2) Was Jesus bullied? We read many stories of how people treated Jesus very mean! There are more stories when people tried to force Jesus to do things he didn't believe in. So, yes, Jesus was bullied.

3) How old were Adam and Eve when they died? *The Bible in its original language doesn't use the name "Adam" or "Eve." It refers to the "man" and the "woman" because it wants to tell the story of all of us and not just two people back in history! We are the ones whom God creates, just like the earliest people on Earth! So, no, we don't have a real age at death for the people in the story the way we would today.*.
