# New/ Important for This Week's Bulletin

SEPTEMBER BEGINS NEW WORSHIP SCHEDULE & ONE MORE INSIDE WORSHIP OPTION We are partially returning to somewhat previous worship plans (pre-pandemic) starting in Sept. The plan is for Saturday night's worship at 5:00 to remain outdoors for as long as we can. Sunday's schedule goes back to 8:30 and 11:00am - both indoors with masks strongly encouraged. (Starting

Sept. 12, the education hour resumes at 9:45 with Sunday School and adult education offerings.) Live-streaming of worship will continue on Saturday nights and at the 8:30 service on Sundays. What won't yet be changing: We will continue to have communion be taken all at once in your seats (bring your own or use our wafers.) We still won't have nursery care or as much liturgy. There won't be printed bulletins or using hymnals (song sheets are available inside and the words to the hymns are available electronically in that bulletin format.) We will have two hymns instead of one. Volunteers will be requested on a week by week basis instead of assigned ahead of time for an usher, lesson reader, greeter. No refreshments after worship.

#### UPDATES REGARDING A REPLACEMENT FOR TODD YETMAN

No one needs to pretend we can replace Todd, but we are going to have a quality musician helping us worship together! That person will bring gifts of their own and we will all get used to the changes. We have scheduled 3 (possibly 4) candidates for a second round of interviews. This round will be with a committee of 10 interested volunteers from the congregation. Those interviews will be concluded on Aug. 28. If one of the candidates is acceptable, we would expect that the person would start no later than Oct. 1. (We will be using substitutes until then.) We are concentrating on finding a quality pianist as the lead instrument because our efforts to find an organist as the lead instrument produced zero applicants! (Part-time quality organists are a dying breed.)

# FOR EVERYONE COMING TO PEACE

- \*Masks are strongly encouraged for all for the indoor worship services.
- \*Whether you drive-in, are on the lawn or worship at home, we have a modified communion option. You can take a piece of bread or cracker with you to the service. We will give the Words of Institution on behalf of all of us and invite us to take our bread/cracker at the same time and partake of this modified version of the Lord's Supper.
- \* In order to keep people's safety in mind following the advice of the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health, there will be a drop box if you wish to bring an offering with you. Otherwise, we will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.
- \* Bathrooms will be available, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing would be required. The doors to the bathrooms will be left open to eliminate having to touch them, and for the sake of knowing what kind of distancing/waiting is needed.

# DRIVE-IN WORSHIP ON SATURDAY AT 5:00PM & SUNDAY AT 9:30

- \* Our worship location will be either from the long sidewalk (lawn area) or from under the canopy at the front entrance, depending on the weather.
- \* We will have sound projection/speakers for all to hear, plus our new transmitter for the FM channel (88.3.)
- \* The worship usually lasts about 35 minutes. Worshiping outdoors allows us to sing with gusto!

#### ONLINE OPTIONS CONTINUE

\* We will continue to live-stream our 5:00 & 8:30 worship services. Assuming everything works, all will be available through our Facebook site anytime.

#### INDOOR WORSHIP CONTINUES at 8:30am with no limits

Here are the notes if you are planning to come

\* Masks are optional, but strongly encouraged.

- \* Congregational singing of a hymn is now allowed, but wear your masks for singing, and hold down the volume. We'll have some printed copies available.
- \* We will have pews marked off so that socially distanced spaces can be maintained.
- \* We won't be having nursery attendants, acolytes, refreshments, lay liturgists, etc.
- \* We will be sending an email each week asking for lesson readers. If you would like to volunteer for a specific week, please let us know.
- \* Bathrooms will be discouraged from being used but are available.
- \* Communion will have options: continue to be "bring your own bread or cracker," or take one of the wafers (gluten free or regular) or take one of the pre-packaged kind.
- \* The service length will continue to be between 30 and 40 minutes.
- \* If you feel sick or have come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and watch via the live-stream.
