#### Can You Believe It?

My dad told the story of one day sitting at a lunch counter eating a delicious hamburger when he heard two women sharing the story of a new grandson who had been born to one of them. That one said to the other, "Can you believe it? They named the poor kid 'Walter!'" You already might have guessed that my dad's name was Walter. He had a hard time not laughing out loud and putting in his two cents that he had survived okay with the name, knowing full well the name was out of date.

Can you believe (it)?! There are some who can't believe people actually landed on the moon. A few rare ones still think the earth is flat. Some can't believe the behavior or words of politicians or the price of gas or who is in the final four for the NCAA basketball tournament. What are you shocked to hear or experience? What do you have a hard time believing because it is so outside of your grasp of what is possible or desirable?

We are coming up on Easter and the proclamation of the resurrection of Jesus. Can you believe it? The women who came to the tomb to anoint the body and found an empty tomb were not so sure, and the disciples definitely thought the women were making up a story that Jesus had been raised. But something transformed them. Something caused them to turn from disbelief to enthusiastic proclaimers. Something energized them in a way they had never imagined. "Can you believe how we've changed?" they might well have asked.

What made the difference? An experience of the resurrected Christ in some form or other in their own life. I get it that their experience of that was unique and special. But immediately, in the proclamation of what they had experienced, others were drawn to have that resurrection power at work in their own life – death to new life; broken to whole; sinner to forgiven. The resurrection was unbelievable until it was real and it was real over and over and over again. The circumstances changed but the reality of new life in Christ was undeniably present. They were open to looking for it, and sure enough! It happened to them. And since then it has happened to people named Walter and Augustine and Yvonne and Adele and I hope you, too. Look for it in your own life! Christ is risen!

More kids and more questions!

Why is it called "Good Friday"? Shouldn't it be called "Sad Friday"?

The day Jesus died is 100%, bad and sad from the point of view that people would kill and betray and deny Jesus – the very one of God in the flesh. Plus, Jesus had to suffer, and his disciples all hid themselves out of fear. But the day is called Good because of what God did! God, even at the moment when people were so mean and put themselves first, forgave and loved. And finally, on Easter, it became clear that not even death or any kind of evil can beat God's love. That Jesus overcame death and evil and shares that victory with us makes it great for all of us.

If God makes everything, who made God? You're right. God has made all of creation and is still creating. One of the things God made is time. So before there was a beginning to everything, there was only God. In other words, no one made God. God just always is and was.

### Because of You

LSSI's Welcoming Center is a safe, walk-in emergency department alternative for people experiencing behavioral health symptoms like anxiety, depression, bipolar disorder, substance use, and post-traumatic stress. Project IMPACT (Immediate Multidisciplinary Pre-Screening Assessment Crisis Team) uses a creative wrap-around behavioral health model with trained counselors available 24 hours a day, every day, to help people experiencing a behavioral, psychiatric, or addiction crisis. LSSI's Step-Up School-Based Counseling Services partners with 64 Chicago Public Schools to provide mental health care for grammar and high school age students. LSSI provides a full continuum of targeted alcohol and drug treatment services for individuals, beginning with medically assisted detox through residential care and transitional housing. From July 2020 - June 2021, LSSI provided critical mental health services to 18,254 clients and served 2,288 clients with alcohol/drug challenges.
