Listening to a Different Voice

“I hate myself.” The words came out with tears flowing, eyes downward. What kind of pain must “John” have to say such a thing? What in his past had now come to a head to feel so broken and empty? Maybe some of you could be John??? Maybe you never get to that level of hating yourself, but you feel plenty of regret and shame or guilt. You don’t wonder why; you know exactly. Like a blow to the chest, you can’t ignore it when it strikes. No wonder we hide from those feelings as much as possible.

While we move about today, people around us (and maybe you) carry all kinds of inner burdens. Most of them don’t show. Most of them don’t reach “I hate myself” with tears and complete brokenness, but the hurt lingers in the shadows.

God knows all about those shadows. To the woman caught in adultery, to the tax collector who had ripped off his own people, to the woman at the well (loser!) who had been through five husbands and was working on #6, to the person (Paul) who persecuted the early Christians – God knows the shadows, the guilt, the shame, the regret. Yes, God knows about those, and that is why God also speaks a gracious word to all who are living in the shadows: “I forgive!” “Go, your faith has healed you.” “I don’t condemn you; go and sin no more.” “Today salvation has come to this house.”

You may not have any heavy-duty regrets. I encourage you, then, to be the one who brings Jesus’ words to life for all those who do. If you live with downcast eyes, please hear Jesus speaking to you. It sure made a difference for “John.”

Worship Schedule

We have partially returned to somewhat previous worship plans (pre-pandemic). The plan is for Saturday night's worship at 5:00 to remain outdoors for as long as we can. Sunday's schedule is back to 8:30 and 11:00am - both indoors with masks. Live-streaming of worship will continue on Saturday nights and at the 8:30am service on Sundays.

We will continue to have communion be taken all at once in your seats (bring your own or use our wafers.) We still won't have nursery care or as much liturgy. There won't be printed bulletins or using hymnals (song sheets are available inside and the words to the hymns are available electronically in that bulletin format.) We will have two hymns instead of one. Volunteers will be requested on a week by week basis instead of assigned ahead of time for an usher, lesson reader, greeter. No refreshments after worship.

Details for How We Worship

FOR EVERYONE COMING TO PEACE

***The IDPH guidelines mandate masks indoors.**

* Children's sermons have resumed.

*Whether you drive-in, are on the lawn or worship at home, we have a modified communion option. You can take a piece of bread or cracker with you to the service. We will give the Words of Institution on behalf of all of us and invite us to take our bread/cracker at the same time and partake of this modified version of the Lord's Supper.

* In order to keep people's safety in mind following the advice of the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health, there will be a drop box if you wish to bring an offering with you. Otherwise, we will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.

* Bathrooms will be available, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing would be required. The doors to the bathrooms will be left open to eliminate having to touch them, and for the sake of knowing what kind of distancing/waiting is needed.

DRIVE-IN WORSHIP ON SATURDAY AT 5:00PM

*** Our worship location will be from under the canopy at the front entrance.**

* We will have sound projection/speakers for all to hear, plus our new transmitter for the FM channel (88.3.)

* The worship usually lasts about 35 minutes.

Worshipping outdoors allows us to sing with gusto!

ONLINE OPTIONS CONTINUE

* We will continue to live-stream our 5:00 & 8:30 worship services. Assuming everything works, all will be available through our Facebook site anytime.

INDOOR WORSHIP AT 8:30am AND 11:00am

Here are the notes if you are planning to come:

*** Masks are required indoors, per IDPH guidelines.**

* Congregational singing of a hymn is allowed. We'll have some printed copies available.

* We will have pews marked off so that socially distanced spaces can be maintained.

* We won't be having nursery attendants, acolytes, refreshments, lay liturgists, etc.

* We will be sending an email each week asking for lesson readers. If you would like to volunteer for a specific week, please let us know.

* Bathrooms will be discouraged from being used but are available.

* Communion will have options: continue to be "bring your own bread or cracker," or take one of the wafers (gluten free or regular) or take one of the pre-packaged kind.

* The service length will continue to be between 30 and 40 minutes.

* If you feel sick or have come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and watch via the live-stream.

Please pray for our world's healing, and for our congregation's ongoing attempts to stay faithful to God and God's leading!

Questions Kids Ask About God

More kids and more questions!

Who was God's mom?

It's a tricky question to answer because God doesn't have either a father or a mother. God just exists before there was time itself, and before there were earthly parents. Why the answer gets tricky is because God chose to become one of us in Jesus. So, God took a "part" of God's own self and made that have flesh and blood. Therefore, earthly Jesus' mother is Mary. We call her the God-bearer (that is, she gave birth to the one who is God in the flesh.) We call Jesus the Son of God because he is fully God, but we also see him as fully human. In that sense, Joseph is his dad.

Faith & Life Experience

We are going to feature stories about people from Peace from time to time. Enjoy this one from Sharon Wesel!

What do a kerosene bucket and a nursing degree have in common? How about Bucktown in Chicago and Wisconsin and Pennsylvania? They all are a part of my story as a child of God. With a black raspberry patch that needed Japanese Beetles removed, my mother sent me out with that bucket to do the job. I learned early on about “sometimes you need to do what you have to do, even if it isn’t fun.” As a nurse who spent more than 25 years just in public health, sometimes the rewards of helping people were so plentiful and easy to come by. Sometimes they were few and far between. No matter when or where, the calling to be present with and for others is real, as is the reality of both the ones I served and me equally being children of God.

My late husband, Dennis, and I moved into our house in New Lenox 50 years ago. Over time, we and our family found our way to Peace. We’re so glad. Being at Peace gives me fun social opportunities from choir to the exercise group to going out to eat together. Being at Peace helps me see the power of people who care for you through deaths and losses as well as on the good days. Being at Peace Church has helped me see how God has claimed me as God’s own child, and how a life lived in community is more complete and fulfilling in every way. To be surrounded by people who are caring – looking out for each other – means so much to me. To hear sermons (I especially like character sermons!) and otherwise get to know a God who operates out of love and acceptance rather than from fear or guilt motivates me to live that way. I am so grateful for how God has blessed us together as children of God.

In 2015, Scolastica, her husband, her five children, her parents and her siblings were able to resettle in Iowa. Dreaming of owning her own farm, she enrolled in the Global Greens program at Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) Refugee and Immigrant Services, a project supported in part by your gifts to ELCA World Hunger. Through LSI, Scolastica has learned how to strategize which vegetables to grow throughout the season, how to keep bugs away from her produce and how to wash it properly before selling it at the Global Greens Farmers Market, through LSI's Community Supported Agriculture program, and through the Iowa Food Cooperative. She has gained confidence from overseeing three farming plots at Global Greens Farm, and her kids have access to fresh, healthy food. Scolastica is proud of the life her family has built in the U.S.
