To Be Honest

Have you ever played the real-life no-win game where you and another person were not being honest with each other? The possible reasons are many – from not wanting to hurt the other person to fear of losing the relationship to happily taking advantage of the other. Isn't it interesting that at least sometimes both of you know you've got a secret you are not sharing; that you are hiding some piece of truth? The results of our game? Not good!

People have tried to play that game with God. We can read their stories in the Bible, including thinking that they can do whatever they want in private, and God won't know; that they can just bring their offerings/be in worship and God won't dig deeper; that "less than" will impressive God as much as it might impress their friends. Every time the story is told in any of its many variations, the words of prophet after prophet and Jesus himself are "these people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." The results of their game? Not good!

On the other hand, what happens when people (we) dare to be honest with God? For one thing, over and over again the first words from God are forgiveness and peace and acceptance. Over and over again, people who thought they would be rejected or seen as less than are instead seen as children of God and healed. The ones who are honest have a real opportunity for healing, at turning in a different direction, of being inspired toward new life. Whether the turning is dramatic or subtle, the adjustment to priorities or outlook can result in hope instead of brokenness. So, instead of wasting our energy trying to fool ourselves, others or God, God invites us to be honest and experience release and inner peace. The results? Yay!!!!

Details for How We Worship

Important Mask Wearing Update & More Seating Capacity in the Sanctuary

Because of the new guidelines from the state and Will County, we are able to have new mask-wearing guidelines!

* For everyone who is <u>vaccinated</u>, <u>masks are optional</u> inside and outside.

* For people who are not vaccinated, we strongly encourage you to keep wearing your masks indoors for your own sake and for the sake of others.

* Inside the sanctuary, when it is time to sing we'd ask all to wear their masks if they wish to sing, and to keep the volume to a moderate level.

* The number of available seats in the sanctuary for the 8:30 in person worship is no longer restricted, so registration is no longer required.

* We have stopped taking temperatures.

* For the outside worship services (5:00 & 9:30,) masks are optional and not required for anyone.

Some of the modifications we have had within worship will continue on the advice of the IDPH guidelines for churches. Those include continuing our practices for communion (bring your own), length of worship, no refreshments, and the like. (By fall, we hope those will fall into line, too!)

We celebrate how many people have been vaccinated and the opportunities we have to get closer to "normal." The more youth and adults who can get vaccinated, the faster we'll get there. Also, starting July 3 & 4 we will invite people to take turns reading the first and second lessons. About two weeks before a given weekend, we will be asking for volunteers to let us know of your availability.

Please note that live-streaming of 5:00pm worship on Saturdays and 8:30am on Sundays will continue.

FOR EVERYONE COMING TO PEACE

*Whether you drive-in, are on the lawn or worship at home, we have a modified communion option. You can take a piece of bread or cracker with you to the service. We will give the Words of Institution on behalf of all of us and invite us to take our bread/cracker at the same time and partake of this modified version of the Lord's Supper.

* In order to keep people's safety in mind following the advice of the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health, there will be a drop box if you wish to bring an offering with you. Otherwise, we will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.

* Bathrooms will be available, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing would be required. The doors to the bathrooms will be left open to eliminate having to touch them, and for the sake of knowing what kind of distancing/waiting is needed.

DRIVE-IN WORSHIP ON SATURDAY AT 5:00pm & SUNDAY AT 9:30am

* Our worship location will be either from the long sidewalk (lawn area) or from under the canopy at the front entrance, depending on the weather.

* We will have sound projection/speakers for all to hear, plus the FM channel (88.3.)

* The worship usually lasts about 35 minutes. Worshiping outdoors allows us to sing with gusto!

ONLINE OPTIONS CONTINUE

* We will continue to live-stream our 5:00 & 8:30 worship services. Assuming everything works, all will be available through our Facebook site anytime.

INDOOR WORSHIP CONTINUES at 8:30am with no limits

Here are the notes if you are planning to come

* Masks are optional, but encouraged for those not vaccinated.

* Congregational singing of a hymn is now allowed, but wear your masks for singing, and hold down the volume. We'll have some printed copies available.

* We will have pews marked off so that socially distanced spaces can be maintained.

* We won't be having nursery attendants, acolytes, refreshments, lay liturgists, lesson readers (but they will resume in July), etc.

* Bathrooms will be discouraged from being used but are available.

* Communion will have options: continue to be "bring your own bread or cracker," or take one of the wafers (gluten free or regular) or take one of the pre-packaged kind.

* The service length will continue to be between 30 and 40 minutes.

* If you feel sick or have come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and watch via the live-stream.
