Special Prayers for Healing – Sat., Jan. 8

As part of the 5:00 p.m. Saturday night service on Jan.8, we will have an opportunity within the prayers of intercession to especially note those who need special prayers for healing. They can be for you or for somebody you know.

First Communion Class – Sat., Jan. 15

Each year we seek to prepare children in the fifth grade (and beyond) for receiving their first communion. We do it in a one-hour concentrated class. A parent/other adult (or two) should attend along with the child. The class will be offered on Saturday, Jan. 15, at 10:00 a.m.

Worship Schedule

We have partially returned to somewhat previous worship plans (pre-pandemic). The plan is for Saturday night's worship at 5:00 to remain outdoors for as long as we can. Sunday's schedule is back to 8:30 and 11:00am - both indoors with masks. Live-streaming of worship will continue on Saturday nights and at the 8:30am service on Sundays.

We will continue to have communion be taken all at once in your seats (bring your own or use our wafers.) We still won't have nursery care or as much liturgy. There won't be printed bulletins or using hymnals (song sheets are available inside and the words to the hymns are available electronically in that bulletin format.) We will have two hymns instead of one. Volunteers will be requested on a week by week basis instead of assigned ahead of time for an usher, lesson reader, greeter. No refreshments after worship.

Details for How We Worship

FOR EVERYONE COMING TO PEACE

***The IDPH guidelines mandate masks indoors.**

* Children's sermons have resumed.

*Whether you drive-in, are on the lawn or worship at home, we have a modified communion option. You can take a piece of bread or cracker with you to the service. We will give the Words of Institution on behalf of all of us and invite us to take our bread/cracker at the same time and partake of this modified version of the Lord's Supper.

* In order to keep people's safety in mind following the advice of the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health, there will be a drop box if you wish to bring an offering with you. Otherwise, we will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.

* Bathrooms will be available, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing would be required. The doors to the bathrooms will be left open to eliminate having to touch them, and for the sake of knowing what kind of distancing/waiting is needed.

DRIVE-IN WORSHIP ON SATURDAY AT 5:00PM

*** Our worship location will be from under the canopy at the front entrance.**

* We will have sound projection/speakers for all to hear, plus our new transmitter for the FM channel (88.3.)

* The worship usually lasts about 35 minutes.

Worshiping outdoors allows us to sing with gusto!

ONLINE OPTIONS CONTINUE

* We will continue to live-stream our 5:00 & 8:30 worship services. Assuming everything works, all will be available through our Facebook site anytime.

INDOOR WORSHIP AT 8:30am AND 11:00am

Here are the notes if you are planning to come:

*** Masks are required indoors, per IDPH guidelines.**

* Congregational singing of a hymn is allowed. We'll have some printed copies available.

* We will have pews marked off so that socially distanced spaces can be maintained.

* We won't be having nursery attendants, acolytes, refreshments, lay liturgists, etc.

* We will be sending an email each week asking for lesson readers. If you would like to volunteer for a specific week, please let us know.

* Bathrooms will be discouraged from being used but are available.

* Communion will have options: continue to be "bring your own bread or cracker," or take one of the wafers (gluten free or regular) or take one of the pre-packaged kind.

* The service length will continue to be between 30 and 40 minutes.

* If you feel sick or have come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and watch via the live-stream.

Please pray for our world's healing, and for our congregation's ongoing attempts to stay faithful to God and God's leading!

Questions Kids Ask About God

More kids and more questions!

How can God be a baby?

We can't really answer the "how" question. But we can answer the "why would God want to become one?" question. People think that being powerful means letting other people know you are something special and can make things happen. But God's power is shown by loving and being humble and what seems to us to be unimportant. Yet God through a baby can help us see how God walk with us through all of life. From birth to death, God understands what it means to be human, and God finds ways to lift us up when we are feeling small and unimportant. God also asks us to do that for others....be powerful by being loving and humble.

Parents/grandparents, please keep sending in your kids' questions! Go ahead and ask them specifically what questions they have about God!

Because of You

Suicidal and ready to jump off a Chicago bridge, a man called Lutheran Social Services of Illinois' (LSSI's) Mobile Crisis Line. The crisis worker kept the caller on the phone, while another crisis worker called 911 and collaborated with the Chicago Police Department to ping the caller's cell phone and locate the individual. Once found, LSSI staff drove to the bridge and talked with the man. Afterward, he agreed to be hospitalized for treatment. Such dramatic encounters are all in a day's work for LSSI's Mobile Crisis Team, which responds 24/7 to children, adolescents, and adults in serious crisis on Chicago's northwest side. LSSI began providing Mobile Crisis Services for children in 2004 and added services for adults in 2018. Last year, these services helped 1,126 children and adults.

Coat Drive to Help Others

One Warm Coat is a ministry of our church to assist in the collection of clean, reusable coats and jackets for donation to local individuals free of charge. We are grateful for our ability in all circumstances to continue in our mission to meet basic human needs. Items can be dropped off at church including left outside the front door in a bag or box. Scarfs, hats, gloves/mittens and boots are also accepted. Thank you for your continued support.

Want to Help Tornado/Disaster Victims?

The ELCA's Disaster Response is a fantastic method for getting help where it is needed. Not only do you get an amazing "bang for the buck," but the money gets channeled to churches and agencies that are on the ground. Trying to send actual supplies is not an efficient way to help – things get bottlenecked and don't reach people with immediate needs. But because of group buying power and the people who are on the ground in the communities with the damage, people get help. Plus, the ELCA's Disaster Response Team sticks around long after the Red Cross and other immediate-help agencies have left. You can donate through the main ELCA webpage www.elca.org.
