A Lesson from the World of Trees

I recently learned about a couple kinds of bamboo trees in China. One begins as a seed with no visible action for five years, and then grows a foot a day. Another one (once above ground) grows a foot a day *to start with!* And then it grows several feet a day!!! It's not unusual to have a 60' tree in a matter of weeks. On the other hand, the white cedar in Canada grows to the grand mature height of four inches. Every tree has a growth rate that is affected not only by its genetics, but also by its environment. (That four-inch cedar grows on the side of cliffs.)

We are approaching Thanksgiving. There are some people who never quite seem to capture the idea of gratitude. It may be that they have been in an environment/family/community where conditions were ones of entitlement (think bamboo and life comes easy) or where the conditions could have been stark (think white cedar.) Regardless, gratitude is absent or minimal.

As the people of God, we are reminded that every day is a gift. Everything we have and use and enjoy is a gift. But so is every opportunity to serve or give. Every time we are forgiven or forgive another is a gift. Can we think? Learn? Study? – all gifts! Are we able to pray? Are we able to see that even when life ends, there is another gift already at work in us? Gift, gift, gift! When we reflect honestly on life for a few moments, we can recognize countless ways we have been gifted....and that life is made up of one example after another.

You already know how to give, and you know the difference between giving because you feel obligated and because you want to. God gives freely and without conditions. To receive that leads us to a natural place of gratitude. The more we have that focus, the faster it grows in us, and the more we desire to express our gratitude both to the giver, and to turn around and give from the heart.

Our church has been blessed. I want to thank you for all your kind generosity as a faithful response to what God has done. I remain so grateful for the resulting outreach to others and the difference that makes. Our Thanksgiving dinner and our Christmas gift-giving are just two more wonderful examples of getting this right. What you do every day in response to God's generosity makes the 60'bamboo tree seem like nothing.

Worship Schedule

We have partially returned to somewhat previous worship plans (pre-pandemic). The plan is for Saturday night's worship at 5:00 to remain outdoors for as long as we can. Sunday's schedule is back to 8:30 and 11:00am - both indoors with masks. Live-streaming of worship will continue on Saturday nights and at the 8:30am service on Sundays.

We will continue to have communion be taken all at once in your seats (bring your own or use our wafers.) We still won't have nursery care or as much liturgy. There won't be printed bulletins or using hymnals (song sheets are available inside and the words to the hymns are available electronically in that bulletin format.) We will have two hymns instead of one. Volunteers will be requested on a week by week basis instead of assigned ahead of time for an usher, lesson reader, greeter. No refreshments after worship.

Details for How We Worship

FOR EVERYONE COMING TO PEACE

***The IDPH guidelines are back to mandating masks indoors .**

*Whether you drive-in, are on the lawn or worship at home, we have a modified communion option. You can take a piece of bread or cracker with you to the service. We will give the Words of Institution on behalf of all of us and invite us to take our bread/cracker at the same time and partake of this modified version of the Lord's Supper.

* In order to keep people's safety in mind following the advice of the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health, there will be a drop box if you wish to bring an offering with you. Otherwise, we will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.

* Bathrooms will be available, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing would be required. The doors to the bathrooms will be left open to eliminate having to touch them, and for the sake of knowing what kind of distancing/waiting is needed.

DRIVE-IN WORSHIP ON SATURDAY AT 5:00PM

*** Our worship location will be either from the long sidewalk (lawn area) or from under the canopy at the front entrance, depending on the weather.**

* We will have sound projection/speakers for all to hear, plus our new transmitter for the FM channel (88.3.)

* The worship usually lasts about 35 minutes.

Worshiping outdoors allows us to sing with gusto!

ONLINE OPTIONS CONTINUE

* We will continue to live-stream our 5:00 & 8:30 worship services. Assuming everything works, all will be available through our Facebook site anytime.

INDOOR WORSHIP AT 8:30am AND 11:00am

Here are the notes if you are planning to come:

*** Masks are required indoors, per IDPH guidelines.**

* Congregational singing of a hymn is allowed. We'll have some printed copies available.

* We will have pews marked off so that socially distanced spaces can be maintained.

* We won't be having nursery attendants, acolytes, refreshments, lay liturgists, etc.

* We will be sending an email each week asking for lesson readers. If you would like to volunteer for a specific week, please let us know.

* Bathrooms will be discouraged from being used but are available.

* Communion will have options: continue to be "bring your own bread or cracker," or take one of the wafers (gluten free or regular) or take one of the pre-packaged kind.

* The service length will continue to be between 30 and 40 minutes.

* If you feel sick or have come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and watch via the live-stream.

Please pray for our world's healing, and for our congregation's ongoing attempts to stay faithful to God and God's leading!

Because of You

In the rural Appalachian community of Myra in eastern Kentucky is a nonprofit called Manna From Heaven, which is supported by your generosity. Work has been scarce in Myra since the neighboring coal mines closed years ago, yet God's abundance can be seen here each week in the prayers, food, seedlings and newly hatched chicks that neighbors receive to grow gardens and support their families. Manna From Heaven learned about ELCA World Hunger's Domestic Hunger Grants, which provide additional funding for this important work. Each week Manna From Heaven provides food and other essentials for 1,500-2,000 people in the region. Once a month, ELCA members drive two trucks from Cincinnati down to Myra to deliver supplies, bringing over 20,000 pounds of food. Every month about 200 fertilized eggs donated by local farmers are hatched in an incubator purchased through an ELCA Domestic Hunger Grant. Families who participate in the chicken program receive 20 chicks, a water dispenser, feed and education on how to raise the chicks. With this support and the families' diligent care, the grown chickens lay eggs almost daily, providing a long-term source of protein. "We don't walk ahead of people, we walk alongside them," said Cindy, a long-time volunteer.

Caregiver Tip of the Month

Children can do a lot for you around the house if you give them a chance and don't have high expectations of perfection. What can children do to help you have a few moments to yourself? Read and/or tell stories to your loved one. Have them ask questions too. Pretend play. Sing. Draw or color with them. Pray. Simple tasks. Talking to them gently about the situation with your loved one when questions arise helps them understand their importance and wanting to help turns into loving rewards. Remember, they are not the caregiver, but know that they do care and want to give even if it's just for a few moments. *(For more information about being a caregiver and other related topics see our display in the narthex)*

Small & Medium Toys for a School

We are always looking for ways to bless others out of our grateful and willing hearts. We have for years invited people to collect small toys (like you get with "Happy Meals" or items you pick up that are inexpensive or items that are like-new that you have in your house collecting dust.) The teacher who uses these as incentives for her special needs students has reported many times her gratitude and the difference it makes in motivating her students – a total win! Helping Santa Cruz's Food Pantry

Santa Cruz has a food and resource pantry for people of their neighborhood who are hungry or in need. The pantry needs the following specific items: **especially cereals, canned fruit, peanut butter, jelly, toilet paper, paper towels, household cleaning products, personal care items such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, soap, easy-open snack-type items (protein bars, cookies, chips, nuts), coffee (ground), creamers (powdered), hand soap (bar & liquid), disposable diapers, dish soap, toothpaste, juices.**
