One of the appealing things about ordinary math is that every problem has a solution. You may have to work at it and while you personally may not get the answer, there is a correct answer out there to be found. There can be formulas to assist you along the way, but in the end two sides of an equation will be balanced.

If only life could be that straightforward. Wouldn't it be great if when you needed to figure out something — whether to take a job or stay put, whether to challenge someone or acquiesce, whether because of COVID to attend a wedding or stay home, etc. — there was always a right answer; always a formula you could turn to and then come up with a sure-fire plan.

Life isn't that way. Yes, some decisions are nobrainers, and some fit a pattern (formula) that we've used in the past. But how often have we had to wrestle with decisions and revisit our tentative answers over and over again? How many times have you had to decide based on conflicting values that all seem equally valid? We can try to imagine, "if this is the plan, then that will be the outcome." But we know from past experience in those situations, we've guessed wrong as often as we calculated correctly.

One of the many things I treasure in being a follower of Jesus is the reassurance that our calling is not perfection but faithfulness. There might be too many variables (even new ones) for us to predict/choose a guaranteed-correct path. Even with all that uncertainty, however, we can follow the way Jesus took: humble servanthood. It sure doesn't lead to "success" in many cases. Haven't you taken a best-guess path only to have it lead to more challenges and obstacles? Yet, history has proven, and our own lives can reflect how following the ways of Jesus does lead to making a difference. It does lead to wholeness for us and/or others. It does lead to discoveries of how God can be present in failure as well as positive outcomes. That's an answer that gets an A+ in my grade book.

Worship Schedule

We have partially returned to somewhat previous worship plans (pre-pandemic). The plan is for Saturday night's worship at 5:00 to remain outdoors for as long as we can. Sunday's schedule is back to 8:30 and 11:00am - both indoors with masks. Live-streaming of worship will continue on Saturday nights and at the 8:30am service on Sundays.

We will continue to have communion be taken all at once in your seats (bring your own or use our wafers.) We still won't have nursery care or as much liturgy. There won't be printed bulletins or using hymnals (song sheets are available inside and the words to the hymns are available electronically in that bulletin format.) We will have two hymns instead of one. Volunteers will be requested on a week by week basis instead of assigned ahead of time for an usher, lesson reader, greeter. No refreshments after worship.

Details for How We Worship

FOR EVERYONE COMING TO PEACE

*The IDPH guidelines are back to mandating masks indoors.

- *Whether you drive-in, are on the lawn or worship at home, we have a modified communion option. You can take a piece of bread or cracker with you to the service. We will give the Words of Institution on behalf of all of us and invite us to take our bread/cracker at the same time and partake of this modified version of the Lord's Supper.
- * In order to keep people's safety in mind following the advice of the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health, there will be a drop box if you wish to bring an offering with you. Otherwise, we will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.
- * Bathrooms will be available, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing would be required. The doors to the bathrooms will be left open to eliminate having to touch them, and for the sake of knowing what kind of distancing/waiting is needed.

DRIVE-IN WORSHIP ON SATURDAY AT 5:00PM

- * Our worship location will be either from the long sidewalk (lawn area) or from under the canopy at the front entrance, depending on the weather.
- * We will have sound projection/speakers for all to hear, plus our new transmitter for the FM channel (88.3.)
- * The worship usually lasts about 35 minutes. Worshiping outdoors allows us to sing with gusto!

ONLINE OPTIONS CONTINUE

* We will continue to live-stream our 5:00 & 8:30 worship services. Assuming everything works, all will be available through our Facebook site anytime.

INDOOR WORSHIP AT 8:30am AND 11:00am

Here are the notes if you are planning to come:

- * Masks are required indoors, per IDPH guidelines.
- * Congregational singing of a hymn is allowed. We'll have some printed copies available.
- * We will have pews marked off so that socially distanced spaces can be maintained.
- * We won't be having nursery attendants, acolytes, refreshments, lay liturgists, etc.
- * We will be sending an email each week asking for lesson readers. If you would like to volunteer for a specific week, please let us know.
- * Bathrooms will be discouraged from being used but are available.
- * Communion will have options: continue to be "bring your own bread or cracker," or take one of the wafers (gluten free or regular) or take one of the pre-packaged kind.
- * The service length will continue to be between 30 and 40 minutes.
- * If you feel sick or have come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and watch via the live-stream.

From Deacon Shari Trotter

If there is anything that Covid has taught me, it is to be flexible. I have learned to roll with what is given to you, to expect the unexpected, and that the way we have always done it is not the way we are going to do it now. In no aspect of my life has this been truer than my role here at Peace and our youth program.

Our youth have been affected by this pandemic in ways that I would have never imagined. What often feels like a minor inconvenience for adults has felt like an upheaval and our youth are tired, emotionally, and spiritually. I have seen this play out in the ways in which we do youth group. Two years ago, we would have had twenty or so kids showing up for Peace 360 but now we have about seven. During the pandemic our youth have learned to adapt by getting jobs, staying involved in sports or music and have started realizing that their schedules are full. So, what do we do? We do something new! We do something that is life giving for our youth instead of the way we have always done it.

Youth group looks different now. We are meeting twice a month. We meet one Saturday a month and one Sunday a month. The age restrictions for youth group have been reimagined as the need for a church family and fun together has become a necessity for all our youth. Youth group is now 5th grade through college age. Our time together is filled with WAY less technology and more relationship, less discussion topics and more silly games. Youth group has become less about the intense study of Jesus and more about experiencing Jesus in our midst as a part of this life with us.

Being flexible is such a healthy and good thing. Being flexible means that your spirit bends instead of breaking under the pressure of change. I am amazed at our youth and their willingness and ability to adapt to this chaotic world around them and I pray that I can have half the wisdom. May your spirit be flexible and may your heart be full!

For many years, Dr. Mark and Linda Jacobson have served as ELCA missionaries in Tanzania. When they first arrived, Mark's role was to develop a team of community health care workers and share ideas of primary care, basic hygiene, sanitation, water control and nutrition in surrounding communities. This then progressed into expanding the Selian Lutheran Care Center into a hospital, which now can perform surgeries, and developed a hospice and palliative care program. Linda worked alongside local women to start the Widow's Might craft project, which lifts up women who have lost their husbands and have had their property and livelihood taken away. The project allows them to use their skills of creating weavings, jewelry and art so they can become economically independent and thrive in the community. Truly the Jacobsons adapted a Tanzanian way of life in treating a person with respect and dignity.
