## From Pastor Gary Erickson

“When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.” Acts 2:1

The Acts of the Apostles (Acts) tells the story of an emerging church. For the early Christians the days following Jesus’ resurrection and ascension were likely filled with anxiety, wonder and expectation.

The wider church today, and Peace in particular live in a place much like the emerging church in Acts. Anxiety, wonder and expectation are part of today’s faith journey.

Anxiety: what will Peace, and the wider church, look like under changing leadership?

Wonder: God is doing marvelous things at Peace, through Peace, and because of Peace. And God is doing amazing things, through, in and because of the wider church.

Expectation: Where will we see the Holy Spirit at work as Peace emerges into the next chapter of mission and ministry? Where will we see the Holy Spirit at work as the wider church grows into our 21st century realities?

Our questions always seem to outnumber our answers.

Always, however, we have the following to lean on:

Regarding anxiety: We have Scripture, prayer, our traditions and hymns, for example ELW# 729: “The church of Christ in every age, beset by change, but Spirit led...”

Regarding wonder: Christian faith practices lead us to see God’s work in our mundane, daily routines as well as in the extraordinary and miraculous. Our sense of wonder is well expressed in ELW hymn #834: “Immortal, invisible, God only wise, in light inaccessible hid from our eyes...”

Regarding expectation: We come to prayer expecting to be heard, to worship expecting to praise God, and to fellowship expecting Christian community. This is well sung in ELW hymn #415: “Father most holy, merciful and tender; Jesus our Savior, with the Father reigning; Spirit of comfort, advocate, defender, light never waning.”

Together we will work through any individual or corporate anxieties we meet along the way. Together we will share the wonder of God’s work in and through our lives.

Together we will live into the expectation of our shared mission: To bring people into contact with the Gospel, and help them grow in their relationship in God in Christ.
