## Important Updates - Interim Pastor & Organist/accompanist positions

Two important updates! These should help us in our efforts to keep moving forward. Trusting God has set us up for very positive outcomes.

#1) The Congregation Council (and committee chairs) met with Pastor Gary Erickson on Aug. 23 and issued the invitation to be our Interim Pastor. The term begins Oct. 1 and is for "as long as it takes" to get to the place of calling a new Senior Pastor. How blessed we are to be in this place. God has provided seasoned leadership to assist you in this transition. We are happy to report that Pastor Gary has accepted this position joyfully. (More about Pastor Gary below.)

In the month between Pastor Dave's leaving and Oct. 1, there will be supply pastors to help lead worship along with Deacon Shari. As luck would have it, Pastor Gary had already been lined up to the be the supply pastor on Sept. 3/4 & 10/11! So, you'll get to meet him and see him in action before he actually begins his call as your Interim Pastor.

#2) A task force of worship and music people met to interview a candidate to be the new organist/ accompanist! Matt Piet is his name. He has a wide variety of musical experience, including some church experience. We repeat: How blessed we are to be in this place. God has provided someone who has ability, experience and personality to help lead worship and assist the entire music ministry. Matt, like Pastor Gary, has gratefully accepted the position and he will begin his ministry with us Sept. 1.

#### Because of You

Your gifts in action: Last year ELCA World Hunger awarded 469 grants to partners in 67 countries and 63 ELCA synods. Lutheran Disaster Response was at work in 47 countries around the world and 51 states and territories in the U.S. and the Caribbean, through a combination of COVID-19 response and other disaster relief. The Fund for Leaders provided over \$3.2 million in scholarship assistance to 317 ELCA seminary students during the 2020-21 academic year. New ELCA congregations are taking shape throughout the U.S. and the Caribbean, nearly 75% of which are in ethnically diverse communities, in lower-income neighborhoods and urban settings, and/or among LGBTQIA+ and young-adult communities. More than 120 ELCA missionary households walk alongside communities around the world.

It takes a team to make the right decisions, to call on the right doctors, to do the research, to find help for every day challenges to care for ourselves as caregivers while providing for our loved ones.
