New/ Important for This Week's Bulletin

JOIN US FOR AN OFFERING OF LETTERS! SEPT. 24 & 25, 2022

What is an Offering of Letters? Each year, Bread for the World invites people to write to their members of Congress, advocating for policies that help end hunger in the U.S. and around the world. During the weekend of Sept. 24 & 25, join us in the library/parlor. We will have everything you need to write your letters. Paper, pens, envelopes, stamps, sample letters, congressional addresses, and inspiring stories of need and success. Writing letters from home is also an option. Write your letter in any way you like, and cover any theme(s) you like about helping to end hunger. These are simple letters of profound impact. (Most people can complete their letters in five minutes.)

The focus of this year's offering of letters is on three fronts. Include any or all or some other way: Expand free school meals to additional children through the Community Eligibility Provision Program and extend Summer Electronic Benefits Transfer nationwide. Make the one-year expansion of the Child Tax Credit permanent, fully refundable, and available to families regardless of their children's immigration status. Otherwise, an estimated 9.9 million children are at risk of poverty. Global FoodSecurity Reauthorization Act (S. 4649/H.R. 8446)

What is Bread for the World? – A collective Christian voice, urging our nation's decision makers to end hunger at home and abroad by changing policies and conditions that allow hunger and poverty to persist. Its work is supported by local churches and all major Christian denominations. It is bi-partisan and has a record of being supported by presidents of both parties. Join the advocates for policies to help end hunger, write a letter that will be read and logged by your congressman's office. It does make a difference!

BECAUSE OF YOU

Your gifts in action: Last year ELCA World Hunger awarded 469 grants to partners in 67 countries and 63 ELCA synods. Lutheran Disaster Response was at work in 47 countries around the world and 51 states and territories in the U.S. and the Caribbean, through a combination of COVID-19 response and other disaster relief. The Fund for Leaders provided over \$3.2 million in scholarship assistance to 317 ELCA seminary students during the 2020-21 academic year. Whether you are a caregiver for a spouse, parent, teen, sibling or a child, you need help with the emotional, spiritual, mental and physical side of reality. These days you might fold your hands in prayer and ask God to always be there. It isn't doubt, it isn't fear, it's just that NEED to want Him near. In the sleepless nights, and the worrying days, you tremble with sadness and laugh with tears. Keep my loved one safe you pray, keep me strong and healthy with each new day. Remind me dear God to always trust, no matter what the day may bring. Remind me too dear God, that my loved one also folds their hands in prayer and asks that I be there. Find more comfort in: Psalm 23, Psalm 119:73-77 and Isaiah 12.
